SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide parents assistance in understanding the State's academic content standards, and assessments, and how to monitor and improve the achievement of their children.

- Parents, when possible, will attend Parent/Teacher Conferences.
- Understand the direct effect parental involvement has on the educational success of a child. Parents will reach out to the school with questions/concerns.
